

- Fourteen externally funded projects in Student Engagement provide a little over \$2.5 million annually.



Low Hanging Fruit

Functional areas should consider...

- Condensing mission statements to one sentence if possible people should be able to recite it.
- Developing vision statements that are aspirational if you were performing at the optimal level possible, what would you be known for?
- Working on identifying and developing KPIs.
- Measuring (assessing) what is important to your functional area.
- Shifting focus to what you can control and letting go of the deficit narratives.

Shifting Gears While Watching for Speed Bumps



Undergraduate enrollment growth outperforms national average

- Fall 2023 grew **3.9**%
- Continued growth from Fall 2022's 3.5% increase
- Rebound from 2012 2019, which saw an 18% decrease
- Opportunity Scholarship
- Roughly 37,000 students receive the opportunity scholarship.
- New Mexico's net tuition revenue is the lowest of any state, **26.8%** lower than the national average, meaning NM students are paying less out of pocket than students in any other state!

Fall 2025 Goals

- 2,500 New Freshmen
- 500 New Transfers
 - Outside NMSU System
- 350 Internal Transfers
 - NMSU A, DACC and NMSU Grants
